In Confirmation this year, we are studying the Old Testament, also called the First Testament or the Hebrew Bible. As we study together, I am reminded of how much love there is in these books! Over 450 times the word "love" appears – God's love for us, our love for God, our love for each other.

It's the month for love, February is. We celebrate Valentine's Day – a celebration of men (at least two, maybe three) - who during the reign of Emperor Claudius, continued to marry people even though it was illegal to marry at the time. Valentine was arrested and dragged before the Prefect of Rome, who condemned him to be beaten to death with clubs and to have his head cut off. The sentence was carried out on February 14, on or about the year 270. Legend also has it that while in jail, St. Valentine left a farewell note for the jailer's daughter, who had become his friend, and signed it "From Your Valentine." That's why on Valentine's Day we give simple gifts of poems, candy, flowers, and cards.

Quick reminder – the flower chart for 2019 is on the door in the Narthex. Dedicating flowers helps our Sanctuary look beautiful each Sunday.

With a prolonged Epiphany Season this year (Ash Wednesday isn't until March 6), we get to spend a long time basking in the light and love of God, hearing the stories of Jesus as he begins his ministry. We will walk with the disciples as they hear Jesus' most amazing message, what we call The Sermon on the Mount, from Matthew's Gospel. And, we experience the one miracle that teaches us the most about God's abundance for us in The Feeding of the 5,000.

It's the month of love. God loves us. We love God. We love each other. As the government shutdown continues, I pray you will be extra generous. There may be some pretty hungry people around town whose benefits are compromised. We will join the other congregations as we support those agencies that feed the most in need. Think about love. Practice love. Be love.
