In our busy, hurried lives, we forget to spend time in the presence of God. Even when we pause to remember, we do so in such a cursory fashion that it fails to penetrate our heart. We may remember God as a concept, but we fail to remember the goodness we've experienced in meeting with [God] as a loving, powerful, and caring person. In our stress-induced forgetting, we forfeit the peace God offers us.

These are powerful words! In this month of September, I invite you to make a place for you and God to spend time together.
