Stress. I would say that this is a byword for this year! We are under a lot of stress. How can we reduce stress? An Angel says, "Never borrow from the future. If you worry about what may happen tomorrow and it doesn't happen, you have worried in vain. And if it does happen? Then you have worried twice!"

How can we reduce stress? Here are 16 ways a Christian can reduce stress!

- 1. Pray. Often.
- 2. Go to bed on time.
- 3. Get up on time so you can start the day unrushed.
- Say, "No" to projects that won't fit into your time schedule, or that will compromise your health – mental, physical or emotional.
- 5. Delegate tasks to capable others.
- 6. Simplify and unclutter your life.
- 7. Less is more. (although 1 is often not enough, 2 are often too many)
- 8. Allow extra time to do things and to get to places.
- 9. Pace yourself. Spread out big changes and difficult projects over time; don't lump the hard things all together.
- 10. Take one day at a time.

- 11. Separate <u>worries</u> from <u>concerns</u>. If a situation is a concern, find out what God would have you do and <u>let go</u> <u>of the anxiety</u>. If you can't do anything about a situation then turn it over to God and let it go!
- 12. Live within your budget; don't use credit cards for ordinary purchases.
- 13. Have backups: an extra car key in your wallet or purse, and an extra house key hidden in a safe place, have extra stamps, etc.
- 14. K.M.S. (Keep Mouth Shut). This simple piece of advice can prevent an enormous amount of trouble!
- 15. Do something for the "Kid in You" every day.
- 16. Carry a Bible with you (or have a Bible app on your phone) and read it while waiting in line.

Valuable ideas that may be worth pursuing - or at least thinking about!

Hello my friends,

As you read this newsletter, I have already begun phase two of our streaming delivery. Actually, I have combined phase two the new cameras, video software, and equipment/cables— with phase three: sound. So, it will be a work in progress.



For the video, we are relying on inexpensive capture cards so sometimes they are not reliable (it would be in the four figures for a professional capture device) but



when they work, they look almost as good; for the sound, I am trying a sub mixer for Pastor's voice to isolate it from the room reverb (echoing as you call it). As I get better at operating this new equipment the Sunday worship experience will continue to improve. We will give you weekly information on other options if the stream goes down on Facebook (ex. we would stream a second

source to a different site, or different page).

If by some miracle we are back together in worship this month, keep in mind the temporary cabling and cameras that will now be in your view.

Finally, please continue giving us feedback. We cannot properly monitor these streams during service (that is why we have a dedicated sound booth in the building plans for the 10-year project) so telling us what you see and hear, both positive and negative, will continue to help.



Some of the new protocols when we do return to the Sanctuary for worship



1. We will temporarily return to 2 services (8:30 and 10:30) to provide for better social distancing and will continue to offer communion after each service (see protocol 10 for how communion will be conducted) as well as drive through communion at 11:45am -12:15pm.

2. Before you enter the Narthex, ushers will take individual health surveys and your temperature. You will be given hand sanitizer and the ushers will direct you to a specific seat. We will alternate seating to the outside of both sides in one pew and the center of the next pew with one pew between for adequate social distancing – providing seating for up to 45 people per service.

3. Everyone must wear a mask for the duration of the service (we will provide if someone doesn't have one).

4. Only the restroom off the Narthex will be available for use.

a. Sanitizing wipes will be available, and ushers will ensure restroom is clean after each use.

5. There will be no singing. Humming is okay!

6. There will be no Passing of the Peace other than what we can do safely from a distance. We have ideas!

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7. You will exit out the back door toward the labyrinth. There will be no farewell from Pastor Pam at the exit after service.

8. Communion will be conducted at the end of service outside near the labyrinth, and we will take the following precautions:

a. Pastor will wear gloves and a mask.

b. The wafer will be dropped by a gloved hand into the hand of the communicant.

c. A personal disposable communion cup of wine or grape juice will be provided.

d. Communicant disposes the empty cup in the provided receptacles.

9. Offering will be collected at the end of service as people are leaving.10.

10. There will be no coffee cart.

11. Ushers and Altar Guild have received training regarding new protocols.

This is a work in progress, and we appreciate your attention and assistance as we craft these policies to protect our church family.
