Cast all your anxiety on him because he cares for you. 1 Peter 5:7


I have a few more ways to reduce stress that could be helpful, especially in these stress-filled days! The count is continuing from last month's newsletter article...

Our "Home Sweet Home" summer session was lots of fun! Our last day of summer session was on Friday, 8/21. We will close the last week of August for our staff work week to get everything cleaned and prepped for fall.

Sadly, our playground sheds were broken into on July 26th and \$3,000 worth of equipment was stolen. Our parents were so sad to hear about this and wanted to help to replace the items that were taken. We decided to do a Color Fun Run with the children on August 5th. We provided each child with a white t-shirt and each teacher had a different color of chalk/paint to spray the children with as they ran laps in the parking lot. We played music and the children thought it was great fun to get as many colors as they could on their shirt! After each class, we shot off a cannon color as a grand finale. Since parents are not allowed to join in person right now, we did a zoom call for them to watch virtually. Thanks to our amazingly supportive parents, we were able to raise \$3,000 to replace everything. Thanks to the security camera footage, Ms. Theriault and I also happened to catch the people that stole from us in the parking lot the following week and called the police and had them arrested.

Due to COVID19 our Annual Auction was put on hold this year. We had worked hard collecting donations, creating baskets, and we were all set to host our event on Friday, March, 13th. On the day of the event we were forced to make the tough decision to cancel the event. We originally hoped and planned to reschedule our event for this Summer, in person, as it has always been. However, with the local and state Health guidelines and CDC restrictions still in place at this time we could not go forward with an in person auction. Therefore, we decided to hold an online Auction in place of our traditional one in order to help cover costs we are incurring during this time. We understand this is a difficult time for many and we know there may be some families who are not in the position to donate at this time. However, at the very least we wanted them to perhaps get a great deal on a basket as a thank you for all of the love and support the school has received throughout this time of uncertainty. It began on a Friday and ended on Monday. We auctioned off 70 baskets and sold 35 tickets to our wine pull which we held on Wed. We raised \$5,000! My heart is continually warmed by the love and support given to our school and we are so very grateful.

Our 2020-2021 school year will begin on August 31 with pretty much full enrollment in all rooms. We are continuing with all of our COVID 19 policies that were put in place for our summer session. Our staffing for fall will be Mrs. Caston in Room 1, Ms. McFarland in Room 2, Ms. Laney in Room 3, Mrs. Skinner in Room 4, Mrs. Griffith in Room 5, Ms. Yang in Room 6, Ms. Theriault in Room 7, Mrs. Palley for our Afternoon Teacher, Ms. Scott as our Floater, and Ms. Fitzpatrick as our opener/sub. We are also in the process of hiring 2 additional part time teachers to help with breaks. We will spend the month getting to know all of our new families and getting to know our current families even better. We will have a virtual Back to School night on Monday, Sept. 14.

We wish all of our graduates going on to Kindergarten success and look forward to welcoming our new and continuing students to another year of growing in *God's Love at CLP*.

The Church in Society committee has developed a new giving plan for the rest of this year. Since we are not able to be in worship together, which makes it very difficult to bring material donations for the ministries we support, we will focus on specific programs each month and collect financial contributions to distribute. Until we return to the physical church space, special offerings can be designated in the memo line of the check or information box on PayPal.

These are the focus areas for the rest of 2020. Eventually, we hope to solicit ideas from the congregation and hopefully have other members tell about their groups.

September: (Christian Outreach in Action) Money collected will go towards our regular 5th Wednesday meal.

October: Habitat: International Habitat for Humanity month. Money collected will go towards the 50 houses planned for Long Beach.

November: Miracle Ranch

December: COA (Christian Outreach in Action) Money collected will go towards our regular 5th Wednesday meal.

Members who have pledged to organizations such as Habitat or Miracle Ranch will continue with their regular pledges.

When we return to "normal" we will resume collecting **items** for the CSULB Food Bank, Joanie's Purses, New Life Beginnings, COA, and LSS (Lutheran Social Services).

We also receive contributions from **Amazon Smile** if you designate Christ Lutheran as the charity of choice for eligible purchases. We have received \$223 since the first of this year. Thanks so much!

Some of the new protocols when we do return to the Sanctuary for worship

- 1. We will temporarily return to 2 services (8:30 and 10:30) to provide for better social distancing and will continue to offer communion after each service (see protocol 10 for how communion will be conducted) as well as drive through communion at 11:45am 12:15pm.
- 2. Before you enter the Narthex, ushers will take individual health surveys and your temperature. You will be given hand sanitizer and the ushers will direct you to a specific seat. We will alternate seating with one pew between for adequate social distancing providing seating for up to 45 people per service.
- 3. Everyone must wear a mask for the duration of the service (we will provide if someone doesn't have one).
- 4. Only the restroom off the Narthex will be available for use.
- a. Sanitizing wipes will be available, ushers will ensure restroom is clean after each use.
- 5. There will be no singing. Humming is okay!
- 6. There will be no Passing of the Peace other than what we can do safely from a distance. We have ideas!
- 7. You will exit out the back door toward the labyrinth. There will be no farewell from Pastor Pam at the exit after service.
- 8. Communion will be conducted at the end of service outside near the labyrinth, and we will take the following precautions:
 - a. Pastor will wear gloves and a mask.
 - b. The wafer will be dropped by a gloved hand into the hand of the communicant.
 - c. A personal disposable communion cup of wine or grape juice will be provided.
 - d. Communicant disposes the empty cup in the provided receptacles.
- 9. Offering will be collected at the end of service as people are leaving.10.

This is a work in progress, and we appreciate your attention and assistance as we craft these policies to protect our church family. Thank you,
