Sincerely, Matt Green, Stewardship Chair **LUTHERAN MARITIME MINISTRY** joined in the 2021 Maritime Industry Salute supporting the **International Seafarers' Center** (120 S. Pico Ave. LB 90802 in our local Ports of Long Beach and L.A.) held on September 16th on the USS IOWA in San Pedro. This year's ISC fundraiser recognized the International Longshore & Warehouse Union (ILWU) and the International Transport Federation. Local port authorities and port industry officials regularly attend this event where LMM is prominently recognized.



Our LMM Chaplains Samson Chauhan and Chim Mandalia work with the ISC, visiting and serving the ships while ministering to the international seafarers and ships' officers. In the past months, many were "taken downtown L.B." to get COVID 19 vaccinations when they were NOT allowed on shore at any other time.

Our mission is "To share the love of God and Jesus Christ with seafarers from around the world" docked in our ports. We "shop" in

nearby stores (Target, Costco, BestBuy, et al.) for their personal needs; we pray, and lead Bible Studies, worship services, hold communion and Baptisms, and are just present for them, while respecting their personal faiths. Most of the seafarers are from East and South Asia, the Philippines, and some from Europe and the Americas. Currently, ships fill the ports with over 50 ships that we can see waiting offshore. Containers are packing the freight trains going out across the US and California. Seafarers only have a few days here!

LMM is supported by our CLC missions giving, other local congregations, our SW CA (ELCA) Synod budget grants, plus individuals' gifts. The Board of Directors are from Long Beach and South Bay Lutheran churches plus a few from a Methodist Church of India in Southern California.

The Church in Society committee has developed a new giving plan for 2021 year. Since we are not able to be in worship together, which makes it very difficult to bring material donations for the ministries we support, we will focus on specific programs each month and collect financial contributions to distribute. Until we return to the physical church space, special offerings can be designated in the memo line of the check or information box on PayPal.

October Focus—Lutheran Social Services --We will be putting up a gift card tree to collect cards for seniors and the homeless. LSS requests cards from the following stores only: Dollar Tree, 99cent Store, Walmart, and Gas Cards, and in \$10 - \$20 amounts. We will also continue to deliver the food that is brought to church to them.

*Members who have pledged to organizations such as Habitat or Miracle Ranch will continue with their regular pledges.

*When we return to "normal" we will resume regular collection of **items** for the CSULB Food Bank, New Life Beginnings, COA, and LSS (Lutheran Social Services). Keep LSS and COA in mind when you do have items to donate. **You can take items directly to their locations** even though **we** are not collecting for them right now. Their addresses can be found on line or call the church office for their phone numbers. There might be occasions where we will sponsor an in gathering of specially needed items for any of these organizations as situations arise.

If you are a Ralph's Shopper, please add Christ Lutheran to the Community Programs partnership attached to your Ralph's card. We received a donation for \$91.67 from just 16 households for March through May.

We also receive contributions from **Amazon Smile** if you designate Christ Lutheran as the charity of choice for eligible purchases. We have received **\$502.29 since we began participating in this program.** Thanks so much!
