Church in Society's giving focus for the month of May is New Life Beginnings (NLB) here in Long Beach. NLB is a Christ-centered shelter serving the unique needs of homeless, pregnant women and their children. The program's goal is to help these women become responsible members of society. The women must go to school, have a job or volunteer at a recognized charity at least 30 hours per week, in addition to doing their share of cooking and housekeeping chores at the home. Because it is a Christian ministry, there are no government funds available, and the entire program relies on donations of cash and 'in kind' goods.
