Dear Members of Christ Lutheran Church,

I am sure that all of you are very interested as to what is transpiring in the calling of a new pastor. Your Call Committee has been diligently working through the steps of the call process under the guidance and support of our Bishop, her staff, and our transition coach.

As you know, our first step was to complete our Ministry Site Profile (MSP), a detailed document laying out who WE are as a church and an essential tool in the call process to match the candidate pastors' ministry skills to the needs of our congregation. Since, we received a slate of 5 candidates from the synod. Of those candidates, 2 withdrew before we had a chance to interview them (they accepted other calls) and 2 had gifts that did not align with the needs of CLC, and we released them.

We found the remaining candidate closely matched the needs of Christ Lutheran. After thoroughly studying this candidate, watching their streamed worship services, visiting their current congregation, conducting additional interviews and more, we identified them as our preferred candidate. We were hoping to be able to present them to Council in the next couple of weeks, but unfortunately, this candidate was also being seriously considered by another congregation. The preferred candidate agreed to move forward with the other congregation, and they chose to withdraw themselves from consideration with CLC. They were very complimentary of Christ Lutheran, but their decision to withdraw was primarily financial.

As with any position, compensation and growth are key considerations. CLC aligns pastoral compensation with current synod guidelines, and we also include an attractive benefits package. There are three things that are used to calculate a base salary – average weekly worship attendance, annual church receipts, and the number of years the candidate has been a pastor. This calculation makes regular worship attendance and faithful giving important.

Currently, we have asked for a new slate of candidates from the Bishop's office. We will diligently continue to navigate our next steps and will trust in God's provision and timing. We are doing our best to identify and recommend to you, through the council, a pastor well qualified to be the

spiritual leader of our congregation. If there is a pastor you know of who may be a fit for CLC, please notify one of us so the Bishop's office can follow appropriate procedures.

In the meantime, please continue to keep the Call Committee and the call process in prayer. We know God has plans for Christ Lutheran and will bring us a new pastor who will be a wonderful addition to our incredible family. We appreciate all of you and your continued support and love.
