In a recent conversation with the folks planning this year's Christmas Market, they inquired if I might be able to share the event info with our partnering congregations from the recent Sermon Series on the "Bread of Life." They referred to this group as the **church co-op**. And I have to tell you-I love it! What a beautiful way to describe this new thing we're doing together. (But be sure to include the dash. I had lunch with the pastors of this group, plus a few additional friends, and shared the name church coop and we landed on calling this group of pastors (not of the same conference or even synod, but a group we've opted into) as the **pastor co-op**. They were thrilled!

Wikipedia defines a Cooperative as this:

A cooperative (also known as co-operative, co-op, or coop) is "an autonomous association of persons united voluntarily to meet their common economic, social and cultural needs and aspirations through a jointly owned and democratically-controlled enterprise".

It's a little wordy, but it does get at the gista group of individuals working together toward common goals and interests. Each church (members, leadership, rostered leaders) is striving to be the body of Christ in the world. We are creating opportunities for folks to connect with Christian community, learn and grow in their faith and relationship with God, share the love of God in word and deed, and serve their neighbors near and far. We have common goals and rather than seeing ourselves as in competition with one another, we're partnering together, pooling resources, exchanging ideas, expanding our reach, and pushing the boundaries of what we thought was possible for us to do as individual churches. We are cooperating. **We are a co-op.**

"For just as the body is one and has many members, and all the members of the body,

though many, are one body, so it is with Christ. For in the one Spirit we were all baptized into one body—Jews or Greeks, slaves or free—and we were all made to drink of one Spirit.

Indeed, the body does not consist of one member but of many."

1 Corinthians 12:12-14

The body of Christ has many members...some in Los Alamitos, some in Garden Grove, some in Cypress, some in Long Beach, and some elsewhere. And yet, "we were all made to drink of one Spirit." United by the Holy Spirit, we join together as the body of Christ in hope and trust that God will do a "new thing" within us.

Another word from Stewardship:

Stewardship is not just about treasures; it is also about time and talent. If you have ever considered getting involved in one of the many ministries at Christ Lutheran perhaps one of our featured ministries would be a good fit for you. Additional helping hands are always valued and appreciated.

Music is such an important part of worship at church on Sundays. It can set the tone of the service, evoke emotion and tie all the sections of the service together. We all sing the hymns and liturgy each Sunday and often leave with an "ear worm" of that one hymn or praise song that stuck with us. Being a member of the choir, we get a preview of the songs for the upcoming week, so that "ear worm" just might get in there a little early. We rehearse some really beautiful arrangements of both traditional and contemporary songs, and then sing them for the congregation as an offertory anthem or special music in the service. But the choir is more than a group that sings each week, we are a "small group." At the end of our rehearsals I ask for "Praise Reports" and then "Prayer Requests." It's a great way to check in and be thankful, and pray for one another. Small groups in a congregation are supportive and encouraging of one another. Although I think of our choir as a small group, I also believe in "the more, the merrier!" There is always room for one, two, or twenty more in the choir – no experience necessary 😉


